Raise the Age Legislation for Attorneys (1.5 CLEs provided by NYPWA): This presentation will provide an overview of the Raise the Age legislation enacted in New York State in 2017 with a focus on aspects of most importance to local social services attorneys.

Working with Adult Service Clients: Focusing on the Interdependent
Relationship Between the DA and Social Services (1.5 CLEs provided by

NYPWA): This workshop will focus on how two specific systems (District Attorney and Social Services) interact and engage with adult service clients, working towards creating an individualized plan to assist the elderly so they have safer abuse-free lives. Emphasis will be placed on effective communication and collaboration between both agencies, sharing information, confidentiality (under SSL 473-3) and creating trusting relationships. The workshop will also de-mystify the criminal justice process for social service providers and agency attorneys. The presenters will describe how APS can make an effective referral to the DA's office and law enforcement, the type of information required to initiate a criminal investigation, useful interviewing techniques of victims, kinds of evidence of abuse that should be documented and preserved by APS and when police can and cannot make an arrest. Statutes governing the secrecy of grand jury proceedings will be highlighted and Penal law statutes that apply to older adults or disabled people being abused will be referenced.
